The Bishop asks the candidate to declare his intention to enter the office of Deacon and to exercise his ministry worthily in assisting the Bishop and the priests and to serve the people of Christ. Then, the Bishop asks the candidates for the Sacred Priesthood to declare their intention to undertake the office of the priesthood and to exercise their ministry worthily in imitation of Christ the High Priest and Good Shepherd.

All stand. The Bishop invites all present to pray for the elect. The elect prostrate themselves and the Litany begins. All please kneel.




